

From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners

Last week I wrote about the importance of knowing scripture. I mentioned that each year at Sunday Mass we go through a different Gospel and that this year we will be hearing from the Gospel of St. Luke. I would like to use my column this week to mention a bit about St. Luke's Gospel.

St. Luke is the most proficient author of the New Testament. While St. Paul may have written the greatest number of books, St. Luke wrote the most, in terms of word-count. St. Luke, of course, is not just the author of his Gospel, but also of the Acts of the Apostles. When it comes to the number of words, St. Luke wrote over 27% of the New Testament. St. Paul, in contrast, wrote a little over 23% of the New Testament.

By profession, St. Luke was a physician. We know this because St. Paul refers to him as such in one of his letters (Colossians 4:14). It seems that St. Luke was a companion of St. Paul. Paul mentions Luke as a companion of his. Likewise, in the Acts of the Apostles, Luke speaks in the first-person when he wrote about certain of St. Paul's journeys (i.e. "We set sail" instead of "He set sail").

By heritage, it would seem that St. Luke was Greek. This makes sense, since St. Paul was the missionary to the gentile (non Jewish) peoples. If so, he is the only author of the Bible who wasn't an Israelite.

There are three aspects of St. Luke's writings that are worth mentioning: 1) his accuracy, 2) his stories about the Blessed Mother, and 3) his emphasis on Jesus' ministry to those on the margins of society.

Concerning his accuracy: St. Luke, who was by trade a physician,

seemed to place great value on getting his facts straight: his writings have constant references to places, people, and dates, and all of those references are without any mistakes. For example, throughout his writings he regularly refers to the names of the leaders of the various Mediterranean realms and the length of their reigns. All of those leaders have been confirmed by archeological and documentary sources.

Concerning his emphasis on Jesus' ministry to those on the margins of society: St. Luke's Gospel dedicates much time to talking about Jesus interacting with women, gentiles, and lepers. While he does this in all four of the Gospels, it seems to happen more often in Luke's. This is possibly because Luke was, himself, a gentile, and wanted to spread the Gospel of Jesus Christ to his fellow non-Jews.

By recognizing the different nuances of the four Gospels we can better grasp the ways in which the Holy Spirit is speaking to us through the scriptures. I pray that this year may be a time for us to dive into our faith through the inspired writings of St. Luke.

Feedback Requested! We would like to hear from our families about their interest in reintroducing Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW) at the 11:00 a.m. Mass on Sundays. During CLOW, the children are dismissed from the main assembly with an adult leader and assistant to listen to the readings and Gospel using a biblical translation that is simple, but not childish. They hear a reflection that can help them apply the readings to their lives, and they practice using the responses and prayers used in the Liturgy of the Word. The children return to celebrate the Liturgy of the Eucharist with their families and the general assembly. This ministry will require the help of several volunteers - adults and teens are welcome.
