From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Two weeks ago, we announced that our Mass schedule will be:

Saturday 5:15 PM at St. Joseph Church

Sunday 8:30 AM at St. Anthony Church

Sunday 11:00 AM at St. Joseph Church

This new Mass schedule will take effect next weekend (October 5th and 6th). Last week, I wrote about how this schedule change is going to be a difficult transition for those who have been accustomed to a particular Mass time at a particular church. I wrote about how we can offer up our crosses, difficulties, and inconveniences as a prayer to God for some particular intention. This week, however, I'd like to focus on some of the positive aspects of this change.

Back when I was in seminary in Baltimore, I recall one of my professors, Fr. Robert Leavitt, spending a good deal of time in his class talking about how we can find ways to confront this growing secularism in our society. He spoke about some studies which indicated that the number of people at Mass can have an impact on whether a parish grows or shrinks. If a particular parish were to have three different Masses, but for each Mass the church is only at 25% capacity, then visitors who come to the church will see an empty church

and will be less prone to return. But if the same parish were to have only one Mass, and the church is 75% full at that one Mass, visitors who show up will see a church that looks full and active, and will be more inclined to join the community. It's almost counterintuitive: if people have a hard time finding a parking spot or a seat, they're more likely to come back.

I know that both of our parishes are already vibrant communities with lots of activity throughout the year. It may be difficult for many of us to accommodate the change of Mass schedule, but I pray that it is an opportunity for us to enable more growth.

In other news, the St. Anthony Rummage sale is this week. I hope that a lot of St. Joseph people stop down to take a look at the offerings. Even if you choose not to buy any rummage, you can get a great meal.

Also, our Fall Bible Study is starting up on Thursday. I ordered a few extra books, so if anyone wishes to sign up late, we can still accommodate you.

Lastly, next Monday, October 7, is the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. We will have a traveling Fatima statue at our 8:00 a.m. morning Mass and we will pray the rosary after Mass, followed by a crowning of the statue and a consecration to the Blessed Virgin Mary. While daily Mass is normally in the chapel, this particular Mass will be in the church.


