

From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

This past Friday, January 24, thousands upon thousands of people from across our country descended upon Washington DC for the 44th annual March for Life. We, Catholics, stand firmly on the side of Life. We acknowledge that every human life is sacred and that no one should be put in the position in which they are tempted to take the life of another. The March for Life is always held around the anniversary of the 1973 Supreme Court decision which incorrectly judged abortion to be a constitutionally protected right. It is a great tragedy that our nation has permitted over 60 million abortions since that incorrect ruling. Fortunately the ruling has since been overturned. But our work, as ambassadors of the Gospel of Life, is not nearly over. It is still our duty to build a world in which every human person is cherished and loved.

Some of our parishioners attended the March for Life on Friday. I thank them for their witness to the Gospel of Life. But even if we aren't marching, all of us Catholics are called to live this Gospel of Life. It is our duty to create a world in which every person, no matter how old or how young, is treated with reverence and love.

I would like you to keep in your prayers our young people. Last Thursday we had the first gathering of Catholic young adults in the Shenango Valley. The event was a great success and I pray this group is a way that our young adult parishioners can grow in their faith and build up one another. On this upcoming Wednesday we will be having the first High School Youth Night for Catholic high schoolers in the Shenango Valley. I trust that God will work great things in the lives of our high schoolers through this ministry.

We Are Theophilus

Luke introduces his Gospel with a message to Theophilus. Little is known about this figure, but he was likely an important leader, someone Luke expected to be influential in spreading the word about Jesus. We do know, though, that his Greek name, Theophilus, means "friend of God" or "loved by God." Luke was writing down his account of the life of Christ for a particular person at a particular time in history, but he was also writing for all people throughout time who are loved by God; he was writing for us, for you and me, that

we may "realize the certainty of the teachings [we] have received."

After this introduction, today's Gospel reading jumps ahead to Chapter 4. John has recently baptized Jesus in the Jordan, and Jesus has just returned from his 40 days in the desert, where He was tempted. "In the power of the Spirit," the time of his public ministry has come.

Jesus teaches in the synagogues of Galilee to great acclaim. He then continues to his childhood home of Nazareth. He goes to the same synagogue where he has faithfully gone with his family on the sabbath, and they give him the book of the prophet Isaiah to read. It is an honor to read, and Jesus does so with great reverence and respect. He reads from Isaiah: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor ..." After reading, Jesus closes the book, gives it back to the person honored with its care, and sits down. "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing," he says.

was — he's Jesus, Son of God, Savior of the World and all. But imagine that moment in time. He's Jesus, a neighborhood guy, son of Joseph. They grew up with him; they know his family. They know HIM, but something's different. He reads with an authority that gets their attention. They can see it. He finishes, he sits, and all eyes are on him. Silence. Wonder. And in that moment, he tells them: the time has come; the time is now. "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing." Mic drop in Nazareth.

Jesus begins his public life among those he loves. Years later, Luke writes the story of that life to Theophilus, loved by God. Two millenia later, we, also loved by God, have the grace of reading the same story, of living the same moment so that we, too, may "realize the certainty of the teachings [we] have received."




